LETTER FROM THE SHOP

VTL turned 5 this year! That's right, Canada's oldest tool-lending library is a half-decade old, and we're aging really well; we experienced our busiest year on almost all fronts! We loaned more tools than ever, had more unique borrowers than ever, hosted more workshops than ever, and had more membership renewals than ever. The tool-lending model is thriving at VTL.

At the beginning of the year, we introduced a new pricing structure to VTL. Previously, a power tool could be borrowed for 5 days for \$2. Under the new model, power tools cost \$1/day, up to a maximum of 10 days. There's a new class of tools too, C-Class tools (high maintenance tools) cost \$5/day. And as always, hand tools are free to borrow. The new model has been extremely effective. A daily price on tools has created a high turn-around rate on tool loans; borrowed tools are being borrowed for exactly as long as they're needed. Also, at \$1/day, a power tool can be borrowed for a day for cheaper than under our previous model. The introduction of a C-Class allows the VTL to lend tools which are costly to maintain. Under the C-Class are pressure washers, thickness planers and jointers. This new pricing model has made tools more available to members, and maintains our commitment to accessibility.

We've had some new volunteers come through our doors this year as well! Many thanks to all the new volunteers this year, you're all been great! But for the most part, the VTL has been lucky enough to retain many amazing veteran volunteers. Two of our shop supervisors, Michael King and Stefan Tjarks, have been at VTL longer than I have! To all of our volunteers; you guys are the greatest. Thanks for your reliability, communication, and lovely personalities.

As this year ends, I'm so proud to be a part of such an amazing community of people. I'm constantly impressed by the tenacity of our members to try new projects and build their own resilience, by the insight and vision of our Board of Directors, the commitment of our shop volunteers, and the generosity of our community partners. Thanks everyone for such a great year!

TOOL REPORT

The VTL tool inventory expanded in some small but significant ways in the last year. We have now begun branching out into food preparation with our first Food Dehydrator. Perhaps this will be a new area for us to explore. Additionally we added some significant wood working tools with a second thickness planer and our first 6 inch jointer. These "C-Class" tools have been in steady use and have generated some fun projects.

The majority of our tools have been donated and we are indebted to the generosity of the wider community who have provided tools to the VTL. As always, we also have made some strategic purchases of new tools where our inventory is deficient in either quality or quantity of a specific tool.

Looking ahead I expect this trend to continue. Most of our tools will be donated and we will supplement these donations with tool purchases.
